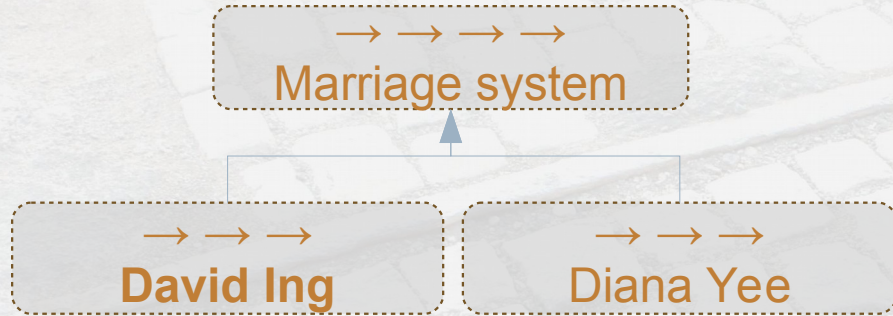

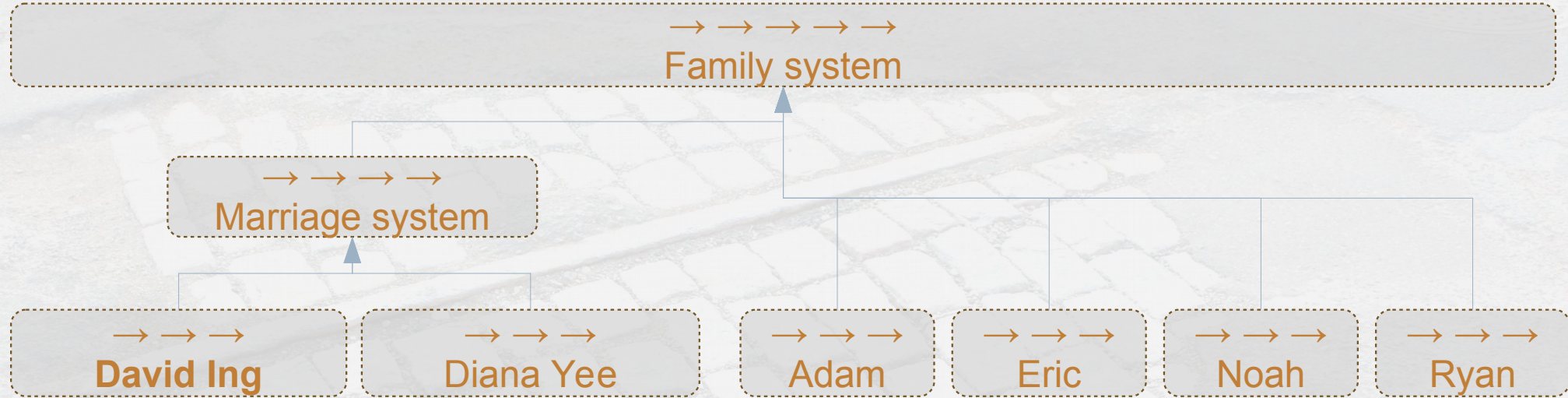
We can see *David Ing* is in a *Marriage* system



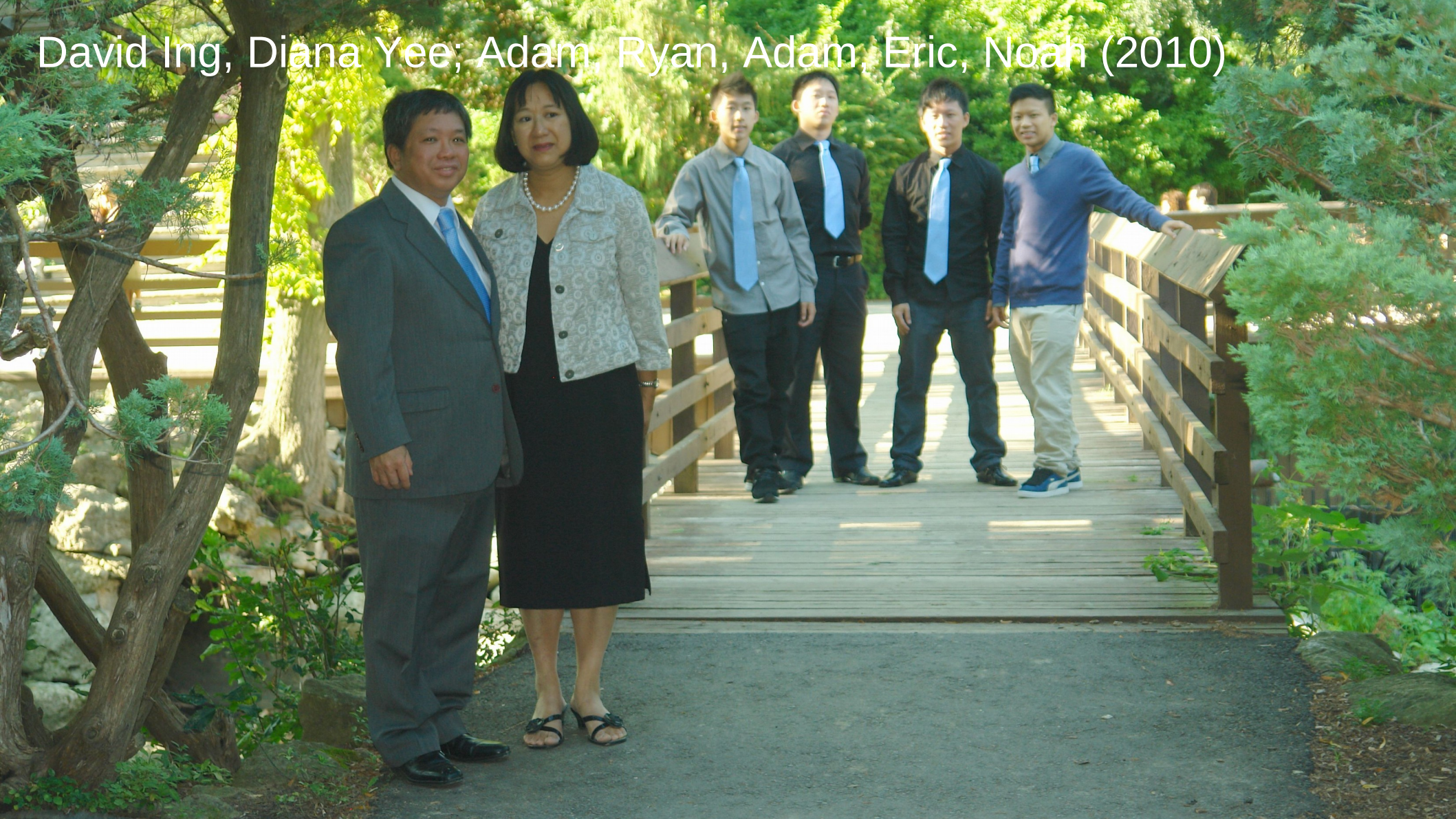

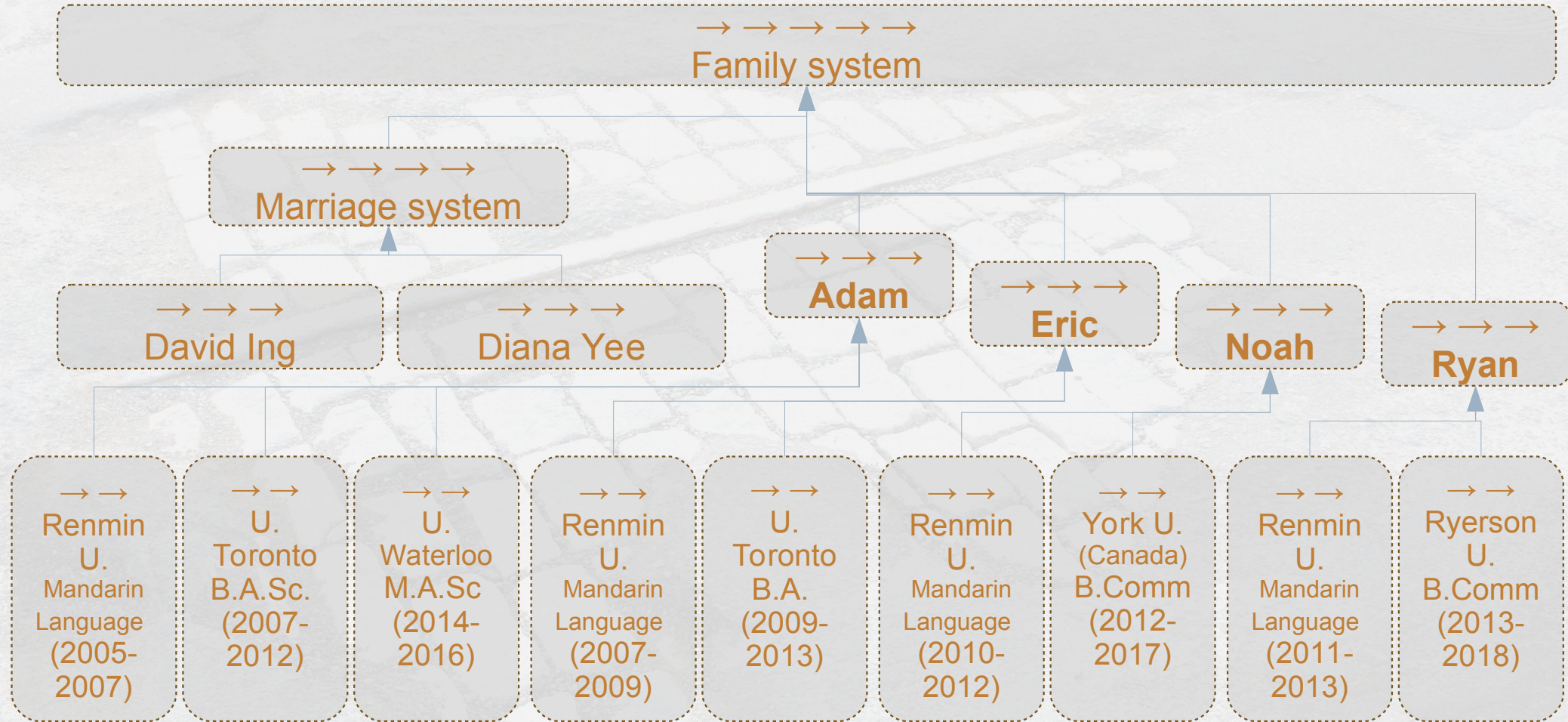
We can see *David Ing* is in a *Family system*

Understand *Adam*, *Eric*, *Noah* and *Ryan* in systems

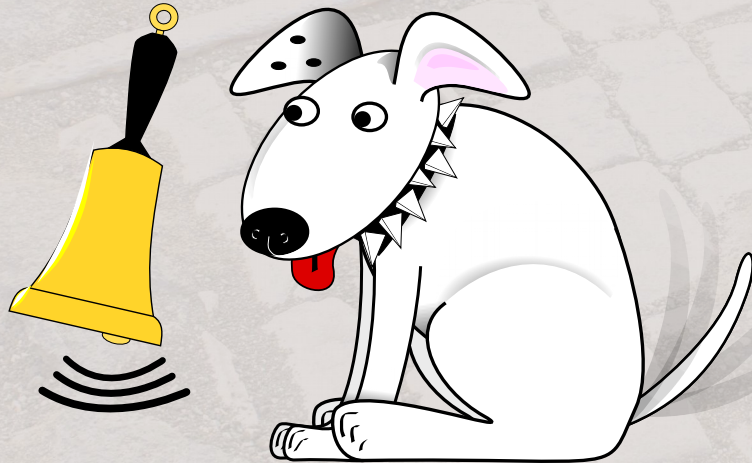

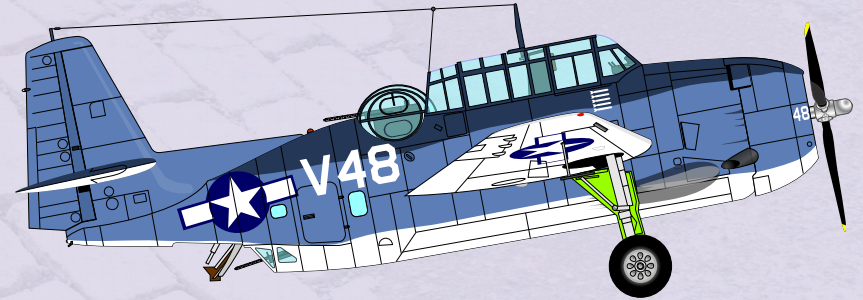
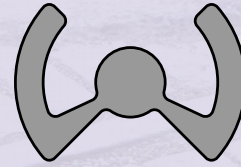
